IN-DEPTH INFORMATION ABOUT THE COLLECTION

Administrative/Biographical History:

It is generally acknowledged that the modern day Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender (LGBT) civil rights movement began in New York City in June 1969 with the Stonewall Riots. Prior to this time such activists as Franklin Kameny, The Mattachine Society, Daughters of Bilitis, and others fought to bring recognition of gay rights to the forefront of American society. While the movement was primarily, and most visually, centered in New York City and San Francisco, periodicals, guide books, and ephemeral material interconnected the larger LGBT community throughout the United States.

Scope and Content: The Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender (LGBT) Collection contains periodicals, ephemera, postcards, advertisements, photographs, and other materials related to the LGBT community. The collection was created by the Archives Center to bring together materials created for the LGBT community. The collection also includes anti-LGBT material, such as a flyer from Parents and Friends of ExGays and Gays (PFOX). This collection documents the LGBT presence and community throughout the United States. The collection is currently strongest in periodicals and newspapers and very strong in material from California. The collection includes material donated by noted lesbian photographer and independent videomaker JEB (Joan E. Biren).

System of Arrangement: The collection is arranged in six series.

Series 1, Periodicals, 1953-2011, is arranged alphabetically by publication title. This series contains a variety of periodicals, newsletters, and newspapers produced by and for the LGBT community. There are publications that are both national in scope and locally oriented. There are early issues of *Gay* and *Gay Power*, two New York City-based newspapers. Other periodicals include *The Advocate*, *Bay Area Reporter*, and *California Scene*, a Los Angeles-based magazine published sporadically from 1971 through 1975 (the Summer 1975 issue covers the period December 1974 through July 1975). In the February 1971 issue of *California Scene* there are two pages of anonymously handwritten notes about items in the magazine. *California Scene* featured Colt Studios illustrations on their covers as well as photographs from the collection of writer-actor Roy Dean. There are a full run of *Steam* magazine and nearly a full run of *RFD* magazine. There are newsletter issues from chapters of the Daughters of Bilitis (Illinois) and Mattachine Society (Colorado). Of particular interest to researchers may be the issues of *ONE* magazine. This magazine began publication in 1953 as an openly gay publication. In 1954 the United States Postal Service refused to deliver an issue prompting a long legal battle ending in 1958 when the United States Supreme Court established the right of gay publications to be distributed through the mail. This series includes the final issue of *Washington Blade* prior to its bankruptcy and the first issue of its interim publication, *DC Agenda*. It includes the first issue of the new Washington Blade after its purchase by new owners post bankruptcy. Because some periodicals changed point of publication

location, only the state has been given, when known, for identification purposes. Twelve states are represented and two foreign countries, with the strongest representation being from California and New York.

Series 2, Organizations, 1985-2011, undated, is arranged alphabetically by organization and company name. This series contains postcards, mailings, and ephemeral information usually given out at PRIDE festivals, street fairs, and large gatherings. It includes publications developed by specific organizations and corporations pertaining to their areas of interest or their LGBT policies. There are materials from a variety of organizations such as Service Members Legal Defense Network (SMLDN) and Parents and Friends of ExGays and Gays (PFOX). This series contains material relating to ballot initiatives in California and Maine on same sex marriage. This series also contains materials from performance and social organizations such as The Gay Men's Chorus of Washington (GMCW) and the Texas Gay Rodeo Association (TGRA).

Series 3, Advocacy, Community Life, 1971-2011, undated, is arranged alphabetically by title. It includes programs from street fairs, the Gay Games, PRIDE programs and guides, and other LGBT related functions. There are general category folders for Health, Historical, Legal, Political, Religion (Dignity, Affirmation, Metropolitan Community Church and others), Sports, and Travel.

Series 4, Publications and Advertising Ephemera, 1978-2011, undated, is arranged alphabetically by category, for instance advertising, or catalogue or guide title. This series includes *Spartacus* and *Damron* bar guides as well as selections from the "Fun Maps" series, bar ephemera, posters, drink tickets, and advertising cards. This series also includes catalogues for clothing and LGBT related merchandise. This series includes a complete set of the documents produced by the Department of Defense Comprehensive Review Working Group published in November 2010 on the results of the survey on the "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" (DADT) policy prior to the repeal of DADT in December 2010

Series 5, Joan E. Biren (JEB) Addendum, 1971-2009, undated, contains material collected by and related to JEB (Joan E. Biren) noted lesbian photographer and "internationally recognized documentary artist". This series is arranged chronologically. This series contains publications, calendars, postcards, catalogues from photography exhibitions, press about JEB's exhibitions, and other items using JEB's photography. There is advertising and promotion material from her book, *Eye to Eye: Portraits of Lesbians*. This series contains material from JEB's documentaries, *For Love and For Life* about the 1987 March on Washington and *A Simple Matter of Justice*, about the April 1993 March on Washington. This series also contains the press clipping and press release files for the 1993 March on Washington used for *A Simple Matter of Justice*.

Subseries 1, Xerographic Copies of Photoprints, ?-?, undated. In some instances, the copyright date that is sometimes stamped on the print is obviously not the date the photograph was taken.

Subseries 2, Posters and Oversize Advertisement, 1973-2009, undated

Series 6, A. Joseph Dietrich Addendum, 1992-2010, contains material related to the production of *AIDS/HIV Florida Keys Update* an educational documentary produced and directed by A. Joseph Dietrich of TCI Cablevision of Key West, Florida in 1990-1992. The program won a "Media Award for Exceptional Merit" in 1993 from the Community Action Network (CAN). This addendum includes letters, scans of photographs, news clippings and a DVD copy of the production. The papers and photographs are in scan

form on the cds in this addendum. There are additional photographs included on the photograph cd that were not donated in hard copy.

Acquisition Information: This collection was assembled by the Archives Center, supplemented with gifts from; Dr. James P. Davidson; ONE Archive, Los Angeles, California; the Thomas J. Dodd Research Center, University of Connecticut Libraries; Service Members Legal Defense Network, and Department of Defense Comprehensive Review Working Group. An addendum from Joan E. Biren was donated in 2010. Addendums from A. Joseph Dietrich, Bradley Reichard, and Franklin A. Robinson, Jr. were donated in 2011.
